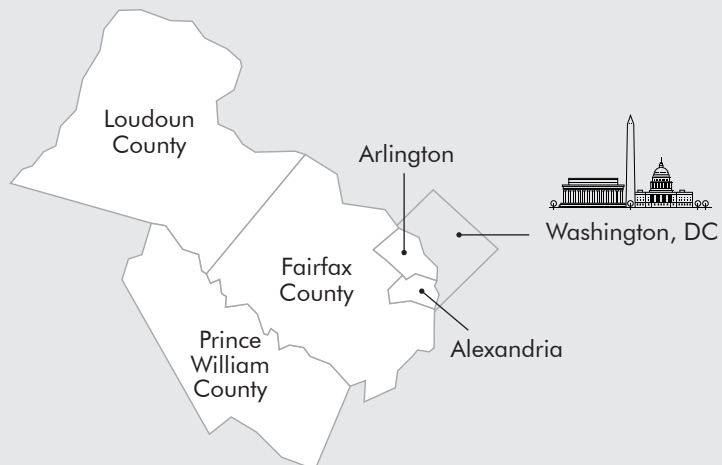

Applaud the performances of world-class theatre productions and meet with local artisans as they create everything from watercolor paintings and sculpture to jewelry and woodwork. Just as hip and cosmopolitan are the unique opportunities to sample drinks not available anywhere else. With more than 45 wineries and more than 40 breweries, Northern Virginia is the ideal place to raise a pint or toast a glass. Sample the libations from George Washington’s own recipes, handed down through the generations. Explore our wineries, where producers hand craft wines in intimate settings ranging from renovated dairy barns to Mediterranean-style estates.

In Northern Virginia, you’ll also discover our storied past. America’s first president made his home here, which has set the stage for the region being at the epicenter of many of the historical events and decisive battles that have shaped the nation ever since. Explore Civil War battlefields and honor the soldiers of wars past with solemn memorials and tributes to our nation’s armed forces. Combine that with the quaint side of history, with tree-lined boulevards and cobblestone streets featuring antique shops and friendly one-of-a-kind boutiques. WHAT'S NEW?

LOUDOUN COUNTY

An exquisite culinary and heritage destination 25 miles from Washington, DC, Loudoun boasts more than 45 award-winning wineries, 30-plus craft breweries, as well as farm-to-table dining, country inns, resorts and historic towns including Leesburg and Middleburg, the capital of Virginia horse country.

Loudoun is an oenophile's dream. Known as **DC's Wine Country®**, Loudoun's vineyards and wines receive attention and accolades from across the nation. In recent years, more than half a dozen new wineries have opened across the county's sprawling rural landscape. From a sparkling chardonnay at **Firefly Cellars** to a Chambourcin at veteran-owned **Bleu Frog Vineyards**, the new additions to wine country not only offer surprising blends and bold varietals but breathtaking views of the Blue Ridge Mountains.

While vineyards have thrived in Loudoun for more than 30 years, farm breweries and hard cideries are now also benefiting from the diverse terroir. In Spring 2021, **Flying Ace** opened on the 55-acre working farm of a former Air Force pilot. Flying Ace is the county's first farm brewery and distillery. Multi-generational farm family, the Zurchmeides, have created an agritourism empire in western Loudoun and recently added **Henway Hard Cider** to the mix. Located on the family's pick-your-own farm, Henway features cider pressed from apples, cherries, grapes and other locally grown products.

The craft beverage scene in Loudoun is matched with an unbeatable culinary scene. With four distinct seasons, rich, loamy soil and a storied agricultural tradition, – George Washington hailed Loudoun as “The Breadbasket of the Revolution” – Loudoun's family farms supply a bounty of fresh meats, produce and vegetables to local restaurants, several of which opened their doors this past year. Located in the urban One Loudoun development, **Lost Fox Hideaway** brings a taste of the farm to its menu with seasonally rotating fare like a roasted butternut squash and apple bisque. Also new in eastern Loudoun is **Urbano Modern Italian** where chef Bill Downes' passion for buying local stems from his childhood growing up on his grandparents' farm.

ARLINGTON

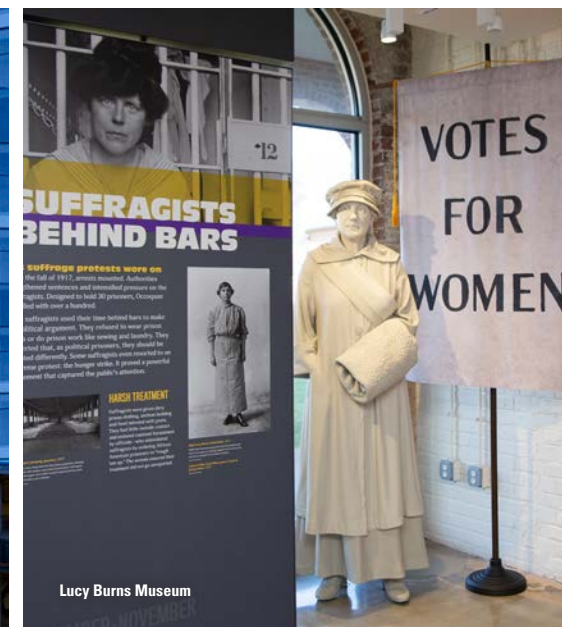
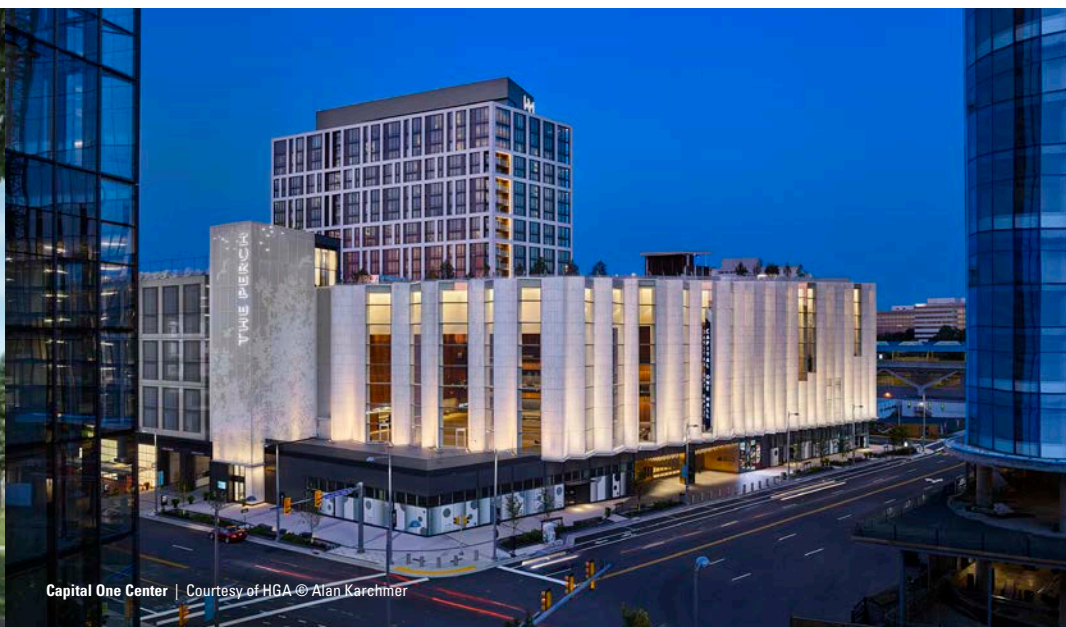
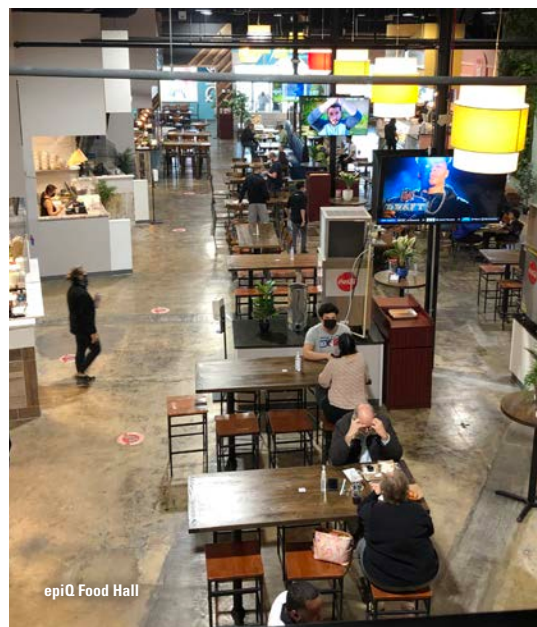
Just across the river from the nation's capital, Arlington may be the nation's smallest geographic county, but it's been getting lots of attention in recent years as the home of not just Amazon's new HQ2 headquarters but also some of the hottest tech startups in the nation. And it's easy to see why. In addition to its many historical attractions and a bustling, youthful population, Arlington offers visitors first-class shopping, diverse dining and an eclectic local arts and entertainment scene.

This is the year to rediscover Arlington, as new attractions open and old favorites re-emerge with new exhibits and stories to be told. The newly-reopened **Arlington House** on the grounds of Arlington National Cemetery gives visitors a whole new perspective. Closed since 2018 for a multi-million dollar renovation project, visitors now see Arlington House as it was in 1860, with rooms restored to their historical appearance and a transformation of the visitor experience. New exhibits and research interpret the history of the Custis and Lee families alongside that of the more than 100 enslaved people who labored on the plantation. This historic place tells America's story from its founding through the Civil War, including the impacts of slavery on the lives of these families and the site's conversion to a national cemetery. Today, it stands as a place of dialogue and reflection to create a deeper understanding of the American experience.

Also now reopened to visitors is the **DEA Museum**, which has been reimagined as an innovative learning environment that tells the story of the DEA through people and their unique experiences. The museum showcases the various roles of DEA agents and employees, delves into the history of predecessor agencies and emphasizes the impact of drug use on Americans' lives. Exhibits on the science of opium, marijuana, cocaine, and synthetic drug addiction also empower visitors with knowledge of different drugs and their risk factors. Nowhere else can guests investigate these topics with the resources and expertise of DEA.

And the ongoing transformation of Arlington with the arrival of Amazon HQ2 continues with plenty of new restaurants and gathering spaces throughout Arlington's neighborhoods. Check out the trendy **Nighthawk Pizza**, featuring local beers and thin-crust pizza with a 90s vibe. **Ruthie's All Day** has already gained a loyal following among locals as a cozy neighborhood spot with some of the best BBQ around. Or stop by **WHINO's** half restaurant, half art gallery concept in the popular Ballston Quarter.





PRINCE WILLIAM COUNTY

From rustic event venues and breathtaking outdoor attractions to unforgettable food and drinks, there are wonderful new things coming to Prince William, Virginia this year.

Visitors to Prince William can plan a relaxing afternoon exploring acres of farmland and taking in breathtaking panoramic water views at **The Winery at Sunshine Ridge Farm**. Situated on the banks of Lake Manassas this new winery offers visitors an array of craft Virginia beverages and has plans to expand soon adding a rustic event venue to the property.

Prince William’s newest private event venue perfect for family reunions, vow renewals, or receptions can be found at the new **Brentsville Hall at Farm Brew Live**. Their ballroom boasts polished floors and an impressive thirty-foot high, arched ceiling which allows for great space flexibility. With a wide range of menu options and a variety of hosted and cash bar plans, they can easily tailor our service to meet your needs. The terrace, located adjacent to Brentsville Hall, is the ideal location for an outdoor happy hour, break-out, or cocktails. Its concrete surface measures 30’ x 80’ and is adorned by a stately, string-lit cedar pergola. Heaters overhead invoke a cozy atmosphere in the cooler months while providing a grandiose view of the vibrant Farm Brew LIVE campus.

Feast on an array of local cuisine at the newly opened **epiQ Food Hall**. Truly a celebration of food, authenticity, quality, and community, epiQ Food Hall is a social destination founded on a shared culinary passion & dedication to great food, with 14 culinary partners. Offering visitors a wide range of flavors from traditional fish and chips at London Chippy to southern style BBQ at Southern Flare there truly is something for everything in this unique new food hall.

FAIRFAX COUNTY

An incredible cultural destination located in the heart of Northern Virginia, Fairfax County will see huge new developments, attractions, and experiences this year in addition to a growing craft beer scene.

Fairfax County recently welcomed the **National Museum of the United States Army** to its expansive array of historic sites and museums. The 185,000 sq. ft. free museum is the first and only to tell the comprehensive history of the Army, told through the eyes of the U.S. soldier using interactive exhibits, a multi-dimensional theater, and a G-STEM-anchored Experiential Learning Center great for kids and adults.

At nearby **George Washington’s Mount Vernon**, an all-new exhibit will showcase a broader look at how Mount Vernon came to be, from Native Americans through Washington’s ownership and into preservation efforts. New specialty tours also include a Founding Flowers garden tour and the “Hamilton: The Musical” tour. In 2022, a permanent tasting room will open at the adjacent **George Washington’s Distillery & Gristmill**, allowing visitors to taste Washington’s Signature Rye Whiskey on-site for the first time.

Highlighting the important story of the women’s suffrage movement in America is the new **Turning Point Suffragist Memorial**, which is the only one of its kind in the country and features an actual piece of the original White House fence from 1917. Nearby, the **Lucy Burns Museum at the Workhouse Arts Center** tells the story of the women suffragists who were imprisoned here for fighting for voting equality.

In Tysons, known as “America’s Next Great City,” innovation abounds at the new **Capital One Center**, a vibrant, mixed-use entertainment epicenter that is home to a premier performing arts center called **Capital One Hall**, a luxury all-suites hotel called **The Watermark**, and a 1.2-acre skypark called **The Perch**. The outdoor skypark features an amphitheater and biergarten anchored by Starr Hill Brewery, a dog park, a sculpture garden, a pop-up food truck experience, and mini-golf.

Additionally, **Archer Hotel Tysons** brings its industrial chic design, locally curated touches, and contemporary offerings to Fairfax County’s vast hotel portfolio. Archer’s design philosophy of melding a distinct nod to the destination shines through here, with a nod to Tysons’ peach grove past and its homage to the state’s indelible slogan, “Virginia is for Lovers.”

ALEXANDRIA

A nationally designated historic district founded in 1749, Old Town Alexandria continues to evolve with new waterfront happenings and independent restaurants and shops to explore.

Alexandria’s historic waterfront buzzes with new experiences to explore, from a rotating, site-specific **riverside public art installation** to permanent attractions such as **tall ship Providence**. This celebrity tall ship, which has appeared in the international blockbuster Pirates of the Caribbean, is a full-scale reproduction of one of the most renowned ships in the Continental Navy. A brand-new pier and visitor center at Waterfront Park will bring Providence closer to the action at the marina and King Street.

The city’s dining scene continues to grow with two 2021 waterfront concepts from Alexandria Restaurant Partners, **Ada’s on the River** and **BARCA Pier & Wine Bar**, located at the new Robinson Landing complex on Old Town’s southern waterfront. Also in Old Town, brand-new **Kismet Modern Indian** showcases the award-winning fare of Chef Ajay Kumar, bringing with him the recognition of a Michelin Bib Gourmand award from his sister restaurant in Washington, D.C., with dishes ranging from red snapper peri-peri to lamb ghee roast. Visit **Mae’s Market & Café**, an all-day food market where you can enjoy a high quality, made-from-scratch selection of coffee, baked goods, salads and gourmet sandwiches.

Alexandria’s historic waterfront buzzes with new experiences to explore, from a rotating, site-specific riverside public art installation to an expanding waterfront **African American Heritage Trail**. The northern route of the self-guided waterfront trail highlights the people, places and neighborhoods along the Potomac, from the time of Alexandria’s founding through the 20th century. Visitors can anticipate a new southern route in 2021.

BREWS AND BIKING

Northern Virginia is known for quality wine, but it is quickly also becoming one of the hottest areas for craft beer, with **more than 40 breweries** to choose from. From quaint breweries in historic buildings and breweries with self-serve beer walls to farm breweries growing their own hops and hoppin’ brewpubs, it’s a great way to experience the flavor of the region. If you would prefer to work off the calories before drinking them in, hop on your bike and explore the string of breweries that are along the **Washington & Old Dominion** and **Mount Vernon Trails** that span almost 100 miles throughout the region. Bring your own two wheels or rent one from **Bike and Roll** or from the **Capital Bikeshare** program.

Visit **Historic Downtown Occoquan** for riverside shops, restaurants and Mill House Museum. **Historic Downtown Leesburg** boasts antiques dealers, art galleries and other specialty shops. And visit the charming small town of **Historic Clifton**, where you can dine at destination restaurants or visit Fairfax County’s first winery, shop antique stores, and end your day with homemade custard.

Homes of great architectural significance like **Morven Park** in Leesburg can also be found throughout the region. Sample a great wine or craft beer just steps from national historical treasures.
